MATHEMATICS

- Following simple directions
- Daily opportunities to count how many people are at school
- Answering yes and no questions
- Days of the week song and rhyme
- Counting collections using different objects
- Rote counting
- Opportunities to recognise numbers single and double digits
- Recognise, write, model, represent and order numbers
- Make groups of items; add one more/one less
- Locate numbers on a number line and on device
- Matching pictures to real objects
- Colour recognition

ENGLISH

- A book of the week focus. This term we are exploring our five senses and the world around us
- Daily exposure to various Nursery Rhymes
- Name writing and recognition with devices
- Letter formation
- Pre-writing patterns using Peggy Lego prompts
- Single letter sounds using Diana Rigg program
- Exposure to sight words and CVC words

- Speaking and listening sharing news, sharing likes and dislikes, listening to others and stories
- Use of devices to display interests, needs and wants
- Develop writing skills and device use skills
- Retell familiar text or event by sequencing images and creating simple statements either written or on their device

LIFE SKILLS

Social Skills, Cooking, Gross Motor and Fine Motor Skills

- Weekly cooking sessions
- Gross motor skill development; outdoor play, sandpit, swing set, climbing ladders, stepping stones, balance beams, ball play, target games, balance boards, building and construction, core strengthening activities, tramopline and use of walkers
- Exploration and experimentation of art using various materials and techniques
- Sensory play opportunities
- Fine motor and hand strengthening opportunites
- Practise social skills to interact with others turn taking and sharing in the home cormer and block corner, asking others to play
- Identify emotional responses and describe their feelings using pictures, words or devices

INDIVIDUAL EDUCATION PLANS

- Individual work boxes focusing on each child's individual goals set out in IEP
- Incorporation of each child's communication device into all aspects of teaching and learning
