NUMERACY

- Answering yes/no questions to collect information and make simple inferences

HEALTH

- Different parts of the body
 - Being healthy, safe and active
 - Protective behaviours Keeping Safe program
 - Feelings and emotions such as, happy, sad, excited, tired, angry, scared and confused



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

BODY MANAGEMENT SKILLS
Balance (balancing beams), upper body
strength, line walking and climbing on
equipment

LOCOMOTOR SKILLS Walking, galloping and running

OBJECT CONTROL SKILLS Exploring the movement of various balls and beanbags

Participate in simple games with support and begin to anticipate the next step in familiar physical routines.

Cooperation with others when participating in physical activities – whole class and small groups.

RULES DURING PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES Boundaries, while control and following direction, safe use of appropriate equipment.

ITALIAN

- Simple greetings
- How to introduce themselves and answer the questions 'Who are you? – Chi sei tu?'
- Colours and numbers up to 10
- Easter and Carnevale in Italy

MUSIC

- Develop aural skills by exploring the elements of music including rhythm, tempo, pitch, dynamics, form, timbre (exploration of sounds produced on percussion instruments) to create music
- Develop performance skills (singing chants, songs and rhymes, and playing classroom instruments in tune and in time)
- Improvisation with voice, movement and play to explore and create music ideas
- Audience behaviour (attentive listening) during performances
- Communicate personal observations and feelings relating to music and identify examples of music in own life

SCIENCE

PHYSICAL SCIENCES

- Examine the way that objects move depending on size and shape
- Investigate how things move push and pull, the speed and direction of movement
 - How to change the direction and speed of a moving object
- Comparing the speed and movement of an object based on their size and shape

ART

COLOUR AND COLOUR VALUE

- Identify and name all colours
- Relate colours to feelings, which colours show happiness, sadness, anger, fear etc.
- Colours can decorate shapes and patterns
- Colours can be used in 2D and 3D artworks

<u>LINE</u>

- Develop understanding of lines
- Lines can be represented to make patterns
 - Lines can be drawn, modelled, constructed, painted, printed, sewn and collaged
